NAME RESEARCH PARTNERS

Shafak organization,, GA use Self-reliance Index (SRI) to measure HHs progress towards self-reliance, SRI was developed by members of the Refugee Self-Reliance Initiative & is designed to provide a rapid, high-level indication of key socio-economic status within a targeted HH using twelve domains associated with socio-economic inclusion (Housing adequacy, Rent, Food, Education, Health care, Health status, Safety, Employment, Financial resources Assistance, Debt, Savings, Financial & Relational social capital, . It may also assist in targeting populations for assistance, highlighting service gaps, and informing funding priorities. The SRI's score has a range between 1-5 (with 5 indicating higher levels of self-reliance and 1 the lowest). It is used to track changes over time.
