PEI announces inaugural country engagement award grantees

Ten World Bank operations were selected to receive PEI Country Engagement Awards following a competitive review of proposals from 45 operations across six World Bank practice areas. The awards are designed to catalyze the adoption and implementation of scaled economic inclusion programming for the poorest, led by the governments. PEI also launched its first <u>Annual Report</u> for activities conducted in the first year of operations, which was a critical period of transition for the PEI. During this reporting period, efforts focused on strengthening partnership and collaboration arrangements with organizations in the partnership network, revamping knowledge-sharing priorities, and supporting deeper country engagements, particularly with World Bank operations.

PEI to launch a webinar series

In March 2020, the PEI will launch a webinar series to synthesize and disseminate knowledge of operational experience with economic inclusion, drawing on case studies from PEI's forthcoming *State of Economic Inclusion 2020 Report*. The Social Protection for Employment (SPEC) Community of Practice on

The PEI team would like to pay tribute to Sir Fazle Hasan Abed for his unparalleled work in fighting poverty over five decades. Sir Fazle Hasan Abed's vision and practice on combating extreme poverty have influenced millions of lives. He was instrumental in shaping the focus of policymakers, practitioners, and researchers on the poor and the marginalized. He will remain an inspiration to so many of us working in development.

Updates and Resources:

- The <u>Poverty Alleviation Coalition</u>, led by <u>UNHCR</u> and comprised of the PEI and 12 INGOs, issued a joint pledge at <u>UNHCR's Refugee Forum</u> to implement Graduation Approach programs with 160,000 households in 26 countries by 2023.
- <u>Trickle Up</u> developed a <u>graduation standards guide</u>, an <u>M&E Guide and</u>
 <u>Toolkit</u>, and a <u>graduation design mission facilitation guide</u> for the implementation of graduation-type economic inclusion programs in forced displacement contexts.
- Lessons from <u>integrating graduation programs into government cash</u> <u>transfer programs</u> were shared by <u>Fundación Capital</u>, drawing on experience in four countries in Latin America.
- Customized <u>mobile technology</u> is being utilized for monitoring, learning, and decision-making to prompt economic inclusion program delivery improvements by <u>BOMA</u>, <u>Trickle Up</u>, and <u>Village Enterprise</u>.

• Transforming children's development with economic inclusion programming takes shape in six case studies from Haiti from the Institute of **Development Studies.**
